	The film revolves around a middle-class man, Mr Bachubhai Patel, and his family living in Ahemadabad. The director portrays relationships through family members who are bound by the values of forgiveness, love for each other and unity in all situations.
	 Bachubhai had a dream to go to the US with his friend Ishwar and become rich. He feels betrayed, however, when Ishwar leaves without informing him and becomes successful as a motel king. This experience turns Mr Patel, a loving family man, into a person obsessed with his USA dream.
	 Bachubhai is portrayed as an authoritarian father who has the final say in everything. He always calls his eldest son, Jignesh, 'stupid' for not being able to go the US and does not acknowledge his wife's opinions. She is a loving and caring mother but is unable to question her husband's actions. The family obeys Mr Patel because they feel his pain of betrayal and his ambitions that remain unfulfilled. Harish also tries to please Mr Patel by making his father's dream his own.
	 Jignesh is very protective of Harish, despite his father's rejection. He is torn between his responsibilities towards his pregnant wife and those towards his parents and younger brother. Jignesh's wife is a caring and responsible daughter-in-law, who refuses to leave her in-laws and believes in the unity of family. Mr Patel's obsession drives everyone to breaking point, however they later reunite when he realises his mistakes during the time his first grandson is born.

	This is a hit urban Gujarati film where the music plays a profound role in its success. • The music is composed by the very young and talented Gujarati
	director, Mehul Surti. The lyrics are by poet, Dr Raeese Maniyar, along with Vivek Manhar Taylor and Jainesh Panchal. The music and all the songs featured are remarkably different from the traditional folk-music-based songs of previous Gujarati works. The musicians have experimented with an Indo-Western fusion, which lends itself well to the story depicted in the film. There are seven songs sung by reputable Gujarati and Hindi playback singers.
	 The title song reminds viewers of their home and family, and the streets they may have grown up in. The song is repeated throughout the film, where the addition of instrumentals such as the flute, builds the intensity of emotions and has a dramatic impact on the viewers.
	 Another Gujarati folk song is converted into a (first of its kind) Gujarati rock song. Ahmedabad's favorite colloquialisms such as 'Jhakkaas' and 'Jalsa' are used in the lyrics, which makes viewers feel that it is truly a film made for them, told in their own dialect.
	 There is also a situational track, which cleverly introduces the family members of the protagonist. The background music is very powerful and changes according to the mood of the scenes.
