- This year an improvement in sentence structure was noticeable.
- However, most common errors were noticeable with the usage of "I" in different cases. For example, candidates often used "\foatha" instead of "\bar{\xi}" and vice versa.
- Other errors are often the incorrect use of gender agreements.
